



E-safety Champions Constitution for 2017 – 2018

Objectives

- To involve pupils in solving problems, offering help and advice to other pupils if ever needed
- To establish the e-safety webpage to inform parents and children about important e-safety updates
- To deliver e-safety assemblies which are suitable for KS1 pupils and KS2 pupils
- To organise a whole school safer internet day to update our knowledge about online safety, and to try out different activities and games with the help of the e-safety leaders.
- To provide all pupils with opportunities to develop skills that will be important throughout their lives.

E-Safety Champions

- Each class will elect a girl and a boy to be their representatives.
- The E-safety Champions will be made up of two representatives from each class from Year 2 to Year 6. In the Summer term, Year 1 pupils can be voted on.
- Extra members can be co-opted if the elected membership does not reflect the school community; for instance, the ethnic groups within the school or pupils with special needs or disabilities.
- The E-safety Champions will meet each half term, or more often if needed.

Term of office

- Elections for E-safety Champions will take place in September.
- All E-safety Champions members will serve for the whole academic year.
- At the start of a new year, the previous year's members **may not** stand for election again.

Responsibilities of E-safety Champions

- Class Champions will report back to their class after every meeting.
- A meeting will be held every half term, or more often if needed.
- Class representatives will take issues brought up by their class to the meetings or to Mr McAdams if they need more urgent attention. They should put across the views of their class, not their own opinions.
- If a representative misses meetings three times without good reason, the class can choose to elect a new representative.
- Year 5 and 6 representative may attend Year 1 and Foundation class meetings to share info and communicate their views.
