Word	* Regular <u>plural noun suffixes</u> -s or -es [for example, dog, dogs; wish, wishes], including the effects of these suffixes on the meaning of the noun  * <u>Suffixes</u> that can be added to <u>verbs</u> where no change is needed in the spelling of root words (e.g. helping, helped, helper)  * How the <u>prefix</u> un- changes the meaning of <u>verbs</u> and <u>adjectives</u> [negation, for example, unkind, or undoing: untie the boat]
Sentence	* How <u>words</u> can combine to make <u>sentences</u> * Joining <u>words</u> and joining <u>clauses</u> using and
Text	* Sequencing <u>sentences</u> to form short narratives
Punctuation	* Separation of <u>words</u> with spaces * Introduction to capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks to demarcate <u>sentences</u> * Capital letters for names and for the personal <u>pronoun</u> I
