<i>Enquiry 5: When Jesus left, what was the impact of the Pentecost?</i>		
Children:	Examples:	
MUST - Identify key events of the Pentecost story - Recognise that the Holy Spirit changed the disciples - Describe how the disciples behaved after Pentecost - Explain why Pentecost is important for Christians	- List events from Acts 2 such as the sound of a rushing wind, flames appearing on the disciples, disciples speaking in different languages and crowds gathering in Jerusalem - Identify how the Holy Spirit gave the disciples courage, helping them to speak publicly, be understood by different people and begin sharing the message of Jesus - Explain how the disciples changed from being afraid and staying together indoors to going outside, speaking confidently and teaching large crowds - Describe how Pentecost led to the beginning of the Church, including the disciples preaching, thousands of people joining them and the message of Jesus spreading to others	
SHOULD - Describe how Pentecost led to the formation of the first Christian community - Explain how the Holy Spirit guided the first Christians - Compare how people responded to Pentecost - Connect the events of Pentecost to how Christians live today	- Refer to features from Acts 2:42–47 such as believers learning from the apostles, sharing food, praying together regularly and giving to those in need - Describe how the Holy Spirit guided believers by helping them preach to others, make decisions about how to live and care for people around them - Identify similarities and differences in responses, including people who believed the message, were baptised and joined the community and others who questioned or doubted what they saw - Link the events of Pentecost to how Christians today show courage by sharing beliefs, help others through acts of service and belong to church communities that support one another	
COULD - Explain why Pentecost is seen as a turning point for Christians - Describe how beliefs about the Holy Spirit influence Christian actions - Discuss how Pentecost might shape how people understand courage and community - Justify a personal response to the importance of Pentecost	- Describe how the arrival of the Holy Spirit changed a small group of followers into a growing Church, including the disciples speaking publicly, teaching about Jesus and large numbers of people joining them - Refer to how beliefs about the Holy Spirit guide Christians to act with courage, kindness and faith, such as speaking about their beliefs, helping people in need and making thoughtful choices - Explain why Pentecost might shape understanding of courage and community, including how the disciples became brave, worked together and supported one another - Share a personal response, explaining whether Pentecost remains important today and supporting ideas using “because”, referring to ideas such as courage, guidance or community
